### MSDH Division of Child Care Licensure Receives Two National Awards for Safety

JACKSON, Miss. – The Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH) Division of Child Care Licensure recently received two national awards for child safety – one for day-to-day activities and one for preparedness in the event of a disaster.

The **2010 John Preston Playground S.A.F.E. Award** was given to MSDH by the National Program for Playground Safety for exemplary care and concern for children by creating safe play environments. A total of 27 of 30 MSDH Child Care Licensure staff members have been certified by the National Playground Safety Institute or through the National Program for Playground Safety.

Five years after Hurricane Katrina, the Division of Child Care Licensure was also recently recognized as one of only 12 states which meets all four standards of emergency preparedness as outlined in the **2010 Save the Children's U.S. Programs Report Card**. The report graded emergency preparedness plans on four standards: evacuation and relocation plans for child care facilities; a family reunification plan; meeting special needs of children in child care facilities; and implementation of a written disaster plan for schools.

"The Division of Child Care Licensure works tirelessly to ensure that all regulations and requirements are followed by every child care facility in the state," said State Health Officer Dr. Mary Currier. "It is an honor for this division to be nationally recognized for diligence and dedication to licensure standards."

The MSDH Division of Child Care Licensure licenses a total of 1,748 child care facilities, including child care facilities in public schools and in 209 Head Start Centers throughout the state.

The programs are collaborating with the Child Care Licensure Division to bring these instructional and exciting new training sessions to child care providers throughout the state. For providers who have completed the *Color Me Healthy* session, please remember that eight weeks after you have taken the course, Donna Speed will be mailing you an evaluation form regarding your use of the *Color Me Healthy* toolkit. Please remember to fill out this evaluation and mail it back promptly so that MSDH can determine the effectiveness of the program. By doing this, you will help the MSDH to continue to receive funding to improve the health and safety of the children in licensed child care centers.
7. The Division of Child Care Licensure knows that the holiday season is fast approaching. From Halloween candy to Thanksgiving dinner to Christmas parties, the Child Care Licensure Division would like to remind providers to stay within the new MSDH nutritional guidelines. In a continuing effort to ensure proper nutrition of the children attending your facility, please serve plenty of fruits and vegetables and fewer high fat/high calorie casseroles, gravies, and desserts.
8. **IMPORTANT** - Many of our licensing officials have noticed that some facilities are overcrowding their classrooms. In an effort to help correct this problem, the Child Care Licensure Division would like to clarify the difference between the maximum capacity for the child care facility versus the maximum capacity in a classroom.

When a license is issued, the Department establishes a maximum capacity for the number of children a child care provider is authorized to care for at any one time. In addition, each room in each licensed facility is measured and a maximum capacity regarding the number of children that can be in **that room** is set. Except for the special reasons that are stated in the Regulations, you may not exceed the maximum capacity in **any given room** within your facility. Violations for exceeding either a licensed facility's maximum capacity or room maximum capacity may result in a monetary penalty. **Please do not hesitate to contact your licensing official if you have questions regarding maximum facility capacity or maximum room capacity.**

9. **Re-measuring of a Facility** - Section 100.2, of the Regulations addresses the re-measurement of a facility. Section 100.2, (4) states, "*The child care facility may be re-measured and re-inspected anytime at the discretion of the licensing agency.*" For instance, if a room appears to have enough square footage for approximately 10 children, but your licensing official observes there are 15 children in the room (even if this is within ratio), your licensing official may decide to re-measure the room to determine whether or not that classroom is over the capacity set for that room or possibly for even the entire facility. A listing of reasons for when a facility may be re-measured can be found on page 34 (#8), of the *Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities*.

# What You Need to Know About SIDS...

Information for Parents and Caregivers

## What is SIDS?

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the sudden death of a baby under one year of age that remains unclear after a complete investigation, which includes an autopsy, examination of death scene, and review of the symptoms or illnesses the baby had before dying. The baby dies quickly, without warning, and usually during sleep. SIDS is sometimes called “crib death,” but cribs do not cause SIDS. SIDS is a major cause of death of babies 1 month to 1 year of age.

## What are some important facts to know about SIDS?

SIDS is not caused by child abuse.  
Babies do not have to be sick to die from SIDS.  
SIDS is not caused by “baby shots.”  
SIDS is not passed from one baby to another.  
SIDS occurs in families of all races and income levels.  
SIDS is not preventable, but there are ways to lower the risk.



## What you can do to lower the risk of SIDS?

### 1. Put your baby on his or her back to sleep.

Tell everyone who keeps your baby to always put your baby on his or her back to sleep. If your baby has a health problem, ask your doctor or nurse about the best sleeping position for your baby.

### 2. No smoking during pregnancy or around the baby.

No one should smoke around your baby. Babies who are exposed to smoke get sick more often.

### 3. Keep your baby from getting too hot.

If you feel comfortable then your baby will feel comfortable. Do not overdress your baby for sleep. Too many layers of clothing and blankets can overheat your baby.

### 4. Put your baby to sleep on firm bedding.

Do not put your baby to sleep on a couch, waterbed, pillow, soft mattress, or other soft surface. Your baby should sleep on a firm mattress in a safety-approved crib. All soft things, like pillows, stuffed toys, or bumper pads, should be removed from the crib. Make sure your baby's face stays uncovered during sleep.

### 5. Make sure you get regular prenatal care while you are pregnant.

Early and regular prenatal care can help reduce the risk of SIDS. For your baby's well being, you should not use alcohol or drugs during pregnancy unless prescribed by a doctor.

### 6. Breastfeed your baby.

If possible, breastfeed your baby. Breast milk helps keep your baby healthy.

### 7. Take your baby to the doctor for regular checkups and shots.

Make sure your baby gets routine exams. Make sure you take your baby to get his or her shots on time.

# Childhood Lead Poisoning Safety Tips

## What is lead poisoning?

Lead poisoning is a condition caused by chewing, swallowing, or inhaling lead. If you live in a home built before 1960, you may be at increased risk for lead poisoning.

Lead can be found in:	Some signs of lead poisoning include:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Paint: house paint used in older homes sometimes contains lead.</li> <li>▪ Pipes and pumps: water pipes and submersible brass pumps may contain lead.</li> <li>▪ Antique pewter, jewelry (including toy jewelry), keys, brass faucets, and stained glass.</li> <li>▪ Fishing weights and lures.</li> <li>▪ Some imported medicines and cosmetics.</li> <li>▪ Plastic window blinds (most bought before 1997).</li> <li>▪ Electrical cords and garden hoses.</li> <li>▪ Pottery, ceramic ware, ceramic sinks, and tubs.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Nausea, constipation, stomach pain and vomiting</li> <li>▪ Mood problems</li> <li>▪ Sleep disturbances</li> <li>▪ Loss of appetite</li> <li>▪ Headaches, fatigue</li> </ul>

**How are children exposed to lead?** Lead-based paint and lead contaminated dust are the main sources of exposure for lead in U.S. children. Lead-based paints were banned for use in housing in 1978. All houses built before 1978 are likely to contain some lead-based paint. However, it is the deterioration of this paint that causes a problem.

**Who is at risk for lead poison?** All children under the age of 6 are at risk because they are growing rapidly and because they tend to put their hands or other objects, which may be contaminated with lead dust, into their mouths. However, children living at or below the poverty level who live in older housing are at greater risk. Additionally, children of some racial and ethnic groups and those living in older housing are disproportionately affected by lead. Children may be exposed to lead at home, in school, at daycare and on the playground. Young children face the greatest risk of lead poisoning because they put everything in their mouths and can swallow lead-paint dust or chips without knowing it.

## How can I reduce my child's risk of lead poisoning?

- Do not store food, liquids in leaded crystal, old or imported pottery, or ceramic ware.
- If you work with lead, change your clothes and shoes and shower before you come home.
- Wash your child's toys and stuffed animals regularly.
- Feed your child food rich in iron, calcium, and vitamin C, such as iron-fortified cereals, eggs, lean red meats, beans, dairy products, and citrus fruits and juices. These nutrients lower the amount of lead your child absorbs.

## Teach Children to Wash Before Meals

Children should wash their hands and face before eating. (Adults should wash their hands before preparing and eating food.)

## Is your child at risk for lead poisoning?

- Does your child live in, or regularly visit, an old house built before 1960? Was your child's day care center/pre-school/babysitter's home built before 1960? Does the house have peeling or chipping paint?
- Does your child live in a house built before 1960 with recent, ongoing, or planned renovation or remodeling?
- Have any siblings or playmates of your child had lead poisoning?
- Do you give your child any home or folk remedies or Mexican candy that might contain lead?
- Does your child live near a heavily traveled highway or street?
- Does your child play with keys? They may contain lead.

**\* If you answered "yes" to any of the questions above, please discuss the possibility of lead poisoning with your child's physician or a nurse at your local health department.
